1931: The Scottsboro Boys

When nine young Black teenagers were falsely accused of raping two white women on a freight train in Alabama, Communists in America were the first in line to lead their defense. With eight of the nine young men set to be legally lynched, the Communists promptly organized legal defense and publicized the case to rally support for a mass campaign that would save the innocent lives of the Scottsboro Boys.

The PCUSA fights for:

- an end to discrimination against all Black people
- full economic, political, and social equality for the entire Black population
- a socialist economic system, led by the working class, and not based on the super-exploitation of Black people
