1882: Chinese Exclusion Act
This banned the immigration of all
Chinese laborers and would not be
repealed until 1943.

1924: Asian Exclusion Act
This banned immigration from Asia.
Also set an immigrant quota for the
Eastern Hemisphere.

1942: Executive Order 9066 and Japanese Internment The forced relocation of Japanese

The forced relocation of Japanese Americans into concentration camps as a response to the attack on Pearl Harbor during WWII.

2020: COVID-19 Anti-Asian Hysteria
The rise in anti-Asian hate crimes
because China was seen as "starting"
COVID-19.

The so-called "Yellow Peril"
A racist myth peddled by capitalist
media depicting Asians as a "threat to
Western civilization."





Japanese American communist who was one of the early leaders that helped build the International Longshore and Warehouse Union.
